Where and when is the externship available?

Externships are available at Cleveland Clinic's main campus and regional hospitals in Ohio. The 10-week program will be from May 13-July 20, 2024.

How can I apply?

Applications for 2024 are closed.

What can I expect after I submit my application?

All applications will be reviewed by a Cleveland Clinic nurse recruiter. If you meet the program requirements, you will receive an email to complete a preferences form and schedule a recruiter intake call. Finalists will move forward to a virtual interview with a nurse leader.

I am not from the area, where will I live?

For those in need of short-term housing during the 10-week program, Cleveland Clinic has approved [housing options](#) in several nearby sites at negotiated student rates.

What hours will I work?

As a Nurse Associate, you will be expected to work full time (40 hours per week). You will be scheduled for 8- or 12-hour shifts, depending on your nurse mentor's schedule.

Is the externship paid?

Student applicants must be currently enrolled in an accredited nursing school (BSN or BSN/MN program) and entering their last year or semester upon completion of their externship. Candidates must hold Basic Life Support certification through the American Heart Association for the duration of the program.
